Dear Parents and Carers

Sad, as belonging to your House is important for Trinity students, but celebratory too as we look back over what has been achieved this year. Sports Day is at The Sheepmount as always and this year is on the afternoon of Tuesday 17th July starting at around 1.00pm. Parents and carers are welcome to join us if work and other commitments allow. This year, please could we ask you to sign in with us at main reception at the Sheepmount if you are joining us. Thank you.

As ever at the end of the summer term, we say farewell to staff who are leaving the school, and there are quite a few for whom this term marks the end of their service to the school and to our students. We are grateful to all of them for their commitment and care, and wish them well for all that the future holds. We hope to see them coming back to visit the school in the years ahead.

Mrs Dickins (Geography) Mrs Priddle (Law) Mrs King (Geography) and Mrs Seymour (Design and Technology) are retiring after many years of service and many successes – we wish them very well for a long healthy and happy retirement.

Ms Witty (Modern Languages) and Mr Jones (Science) are moving on to pastures new, perhaps as far afield as Australia, or the North East of England – best wishes to them for their moves.

Congratulations to Mr Priddle on his promotion to become Head of History from September in another local school.

Best wishes to Mr Southwell (Science) who is making a career change, having taught Physics and Astronomy here, and having served as a governor of the school.

We are saying our 'not quite goodbyes' to four colleagues: Mrs McNeill is not going to be a Higher Level Teaching Assistant in the Learning Support department, but from 1st September will join the English department in order to train to become a teacher. Mrs Hurst is moving to be part-time teacher in Learning Support. Mrs Robinson is stepping down from her role as Head of House to move to part-time teacher of Maths. Ms Hopley is stepping down from her role as Head of Sixth Form, in which she has been outstanding in her care for students and guidance for them. Important Information for the weeks ahead

- 1 School will close for the summer holidays on **Thursday 19th July at 12.30pm.**
- 2 **A level Results Day – Thursday 16th August** - in the Carliol Library - from **8.30am** for Year 13 and then **10.30am** for Year 12.

Information for Parents and Carers of a practical nature

School Uniform

We have made three small changes to the uniform for September. We have taken out reference to nail varnish and hair ornaments. As it has become increasingly difficult to distinguish between types of shoe, we are now saying 'black shoes'. Students must bring a change of footwear for PE.

In full, the uniform code is:

All students in Years 7 to 11 are expected to wear the school uniform and this should be worn throughout each school day, during journeys to and from school and for other formal school events as required. From time to time fashions among students emerge which are inappropriate with school uniform. If worn, make up should be subtle. Students are not permitted to dye their hair with any unnatural hair colour e.g. green or pink. Parents/carers who permit their children to do so will be asked to ensure that the dye is reversed back to the original natural colour. Jewellery should not be worn, for safety and security reasons. However girls are allowed one small pair of stud earrings in the lower part of the earlobe.

All items of clothing required for the school uniform are listed below:

YEARS 7, 8, 9 and 10

Pullover - Black v-neck, with school badge, and House coloured flash

White shirt and school tie (for boys)

White shirt or blouse, open-necked style (for girls)

Trousers - Black (in traditional, tailored style.) Girls may wear a black traditional skirt.

Black shoes - no large or high heels.

YEAR 11

A black crew neck sweater/sweatshirt with school badge and House coloured flash should be worn, and a tie is no longer required. A smart white polo shirt is acceptable under the sweater.

PE KIT FOR ALL YEARS

Plain white round-necked T-shirt for indoors or summer and school rugby top for outdoors or winter.

Plain black shorts (no brand logo)

Plain, long black socks

Trainers

Football boots (boys and girls)

Shin pads are required for hockey and football

Swimming costume

Tracksuits are optional – Plain black track suit top and trousers, these must be plain and not coloured but they must bear the Trinity logo (badge)

Weatherproof top from The Uniform Shop (optional)

Year 13 Leavers' Ball

Holland Trip

On 1st July 52 Year 7 students and 6 members of staff left Carlisle heading for the Netherlands. This was the sixth time the Geography Department had taken students to the Netherlands, initially to the coastal resort town of Noordwijk and recently to Haarlem. Having made the overnight ferry crossing from Hull, we spent time visiting cultural, historic and tourist attractions. On the first day, we visited a huge scale dam project called Keringhuis on the River Mass in Rotterdam which was built to stop flooding following the 1953 storm surge that claimed almost 2,000 lives. We then visited Rotterdam Zoo, one of the oldest in the world. We spent the next day in Amsterdam looking at the redevelopment of the Amsterdam Arena, the new home of Ajax FC, having visited the old De Meer area of the city which was the location of the old stadium, now a housing estate with street names like 'Wembley Laan.' Into Amsterdam itself we saw the city from the best angle, on a canal boat before our final stop of the day at the Anne Frank Museum and a very moving experience. Based in the historic city of Haarlem, we then looked at tourism and how many of the features of the city were aimed at tourists compared to services for the locals. The final day was spent in Efteling Theme Park before we began the long journey back to Carlisle.

Acoustic Night

Trinity School held their first Acoustic Evening on Friday 15th June. The concept of the evening was to use no backing tracks and therefore to have all the music live. The night included instrumental pieces by Georgina Hubberstey and Haydn Gilbert on saxophones, Katie Scott on piano and Matthew Mellor on guitar. There was also a variety of different singers including Rebecca Coulter (who wrote her own song); a duet by Eden Robinson and Jessica Cassidy; Guy Watson, Emily Reay and Finley Teasdale singing and playing guitar; and Dominique Toms and Kimberley Birrell singing with accompaniment from Ben Draper. The evening was well received by all and the performers enjoyed a wonderful experience; thank you to all those who performed and a big thank you to Ben Draper who helped with the organisation of the event.

Cambridge Chemistry Challenge Competition.

Sophie Howell of Year 12 was awarded a Copper Award in the Cambridge Chemistry Challenge Competition. This award was a great achievement as no coaching or preparation was given, Sophie used her natural understanding of the subject to apply knowledge she had learnt throughout the year to very difficult Chemistry based questions.

Art and Photography Exhibition

Trinity Photography and Art and Design students were pleased that the Mayor of Carlisle, Councillor David Wilson, could open their exhibition of 'A' level work on Wednesday 27th June in the beautiful, historical Devonshire Hall. The work ranged from Fine Art printing, large scale oil paintings, innovative use of mixed media and Fine Art textile pieces to a diverse display of Photography. This included Portraiture, Studio and Location based photography, use of experimental techniques, installation and moving imagery. Many of the students have secured places at top Art colleges and Universities such as Edinburgh and Leeds and this was a chance for their family, friends and teachers to celebrate their achievements over the past two years. Ex-pupil, Alex Messenger also introduced the blueprint for the first Trinity Arts publication which will be officially launched at a celebration evening dedicated to its conception and production.

Church School Awards 2012

As you know, Trinity had been selected as a Regional Winner of the Church School Awards 2012 in the North West and Northern Ireland secondary school category. Launched in 2010, the Church School Awards are designed to promote the work done in the areas of community cohesion and global citizenship. The awards are an opportunity for everyone involved in Christian education to celebrate the unique and vital work that students, teachers, governors and staff do for their local communities, for our country and throughout the world. A Gala Ceremony for regional winners took place on 28th June at Methodist Church House in London. The school was represented by Oliver Winter (Head Boy last year and part of the Uganda Team) and Katie Scott (Year 8, who gave her money box savings to the project), as well as the Head Teacher, the Chair of Governors, Mr Brian Armstrong, the School Chaplain, Mrs Jen Milligan, and Mrs Alison Jary, Uganda Project Leader.
